## CUBING & CHARGEABLE WEIGHT RULES



## Definitions

- Stackable: Can load beneath other freight
- Top-Loadable: Can load on top of other freight
- Non-stackable: Can not stack on top of or beneath other freight.
- Overlength: Single pallet or piece greater than 144 inches (12 feet) long

<ul> <li>Stackable or Non-stackable or Top-loadable</li> <li>640 cubic feet or 10 lineal feet of trailer total or over</li> </ul>	- Subject to 1000lbs per lineal foot
<ul> <li>US &amp; Cross-border shipments</li> <li>640 cubic feet or 10 lineal feet of trailer total or over</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Subject to 750lbs per lineal foot at class 70</li> <li>Will not apply if less than original class charge</li> </ul>
- Pallets or pieces are Overlength (144 inches - 287 inches)	- Subject to an Accessorial Charge - Subject to 10lbs per cubic foot
- Pallets or pieces are Overlength (288 inches and greater)	- Subject to an Accessorial Charge - Subject to 10lbs per cubic foot

\* \* Chargeable weight is equal to the greater of actual weight or cubed weight as determined by the above.
